In response, we began supporting his efforts to deliver food and medical care. At this time, we are preparing to send a team into Syria as soon as it is safe to do so.

2024 Our Projects

UKRAINE

Our Ukraine team made a significant impact by hand delivering complex orthopedic equipment to four trauma hospitals through collaboration with **SIGN INTERNATIONAL FX CARE**. Additionally, we provided abdominal/liver surgical instruments and new endoscopic equipment to Zytomer Regional Hospital with a grant from **NOVA UKRAINE**. Our colleague Max, who manages a partner NGO in Ukraine, diligently supplies essential equipment to both civilian and frontline medical teams. At his request, Hands On Global supplied 3,000 CAT tourniquets through our **STOP THE BLEED** Campaign. These tourniquets are life and limb saving and can make a critical difference in emergency situations. We also provided financial support for the acquisition of critical emergency medications. Our team remains steadfast in its commitment to continuing our support for Ukraine.

Refugee Support

Over the years, our teams have worked in various refugee camps in Greece. We have had the honor of working with refugee volunteers in the camp clinics. We have met their families and heard their stories of fleeing for their lives. Some of these individuals have been granted asylum within the European Union, yet their resettlement journeys have been arduous, and resettlement remains a complex process and often with very minimal support. Our team has undertaken road trips throughout the European Union to provide assistance and check-ins whenever necessary. Our unwavering commitment to assisting those in need has only grown stronger over time. We have pledged never to forget the remarkable individuals we have encountered and had the privilege to work with.











Our colleague Omar Alshakhal, from **Refugee4Refugees**, continues his tireless efforts in Greece supporting refugees within the EVROS region. We are committed to providing ongoing financial support to his refugee support projects.

Syria The recent collapse of the Assad regime in Syria has finally ended 14 years of a devastating civil war. Omar Alshakhal, a refugee in exile for 13 years, returned to Syria. He has been diligently documenting the country's devastation through video reports. The situation in Syria has deteriorated significantly, with widespread destruction and dire humanitarian conditions resulting in overwhelming needs.

The population is grappling with severe food insecurity, and medical care is severely compromised. In response, we have provided emergency funds to Omar to support individuals in his home region - Deir Ez Zor. These funds have



enabled Omar to purchase food bags and flour to establish a bakery, addressing the urgent need for basic foods. We have engaged in FaceTime conversations with doctors at the local hospital. They shared images of the damage and explained the urgent need for repairs and equipment. The hospital is severely understaffed as many medical professionals have been

The Hands On Global team is currently mobilizing to provide support to Syria. We are currently

exploring the most effective ways to contribute to the humanitarian efforts in the region with a possibility of sending in a medical team.







The Helena Area Refugee Resettlement Team (HARRT) - a domestic initiative of Hands On Global, is actively engaged in providing assistance to refugees in Helena, Montana. Collaborating with the International Rescue Committee (IRC), HARRT facilitates the resettlement of refugees by enabling them to establish new lives within the community. The HARRT CENTER serves as a place for comprehensive resource services offering support to refugees across a wide range of needs. Additionally, the organization hosts Refugee Empowerment Programs, empowering refugees to become independent and self sufficient. Community integration activities are regularly held here. In 2024, HARRT welcomed 31 refugees, predominantly from Afghanistan and the Democratic Republic of Congo. It is truly gratifying to assist these refugees in starting a new life safely, with opportunities for growth. They have all found gainful employment and are grateful for their childrens opportunity to attend school. We are so appreciative to the Helena community who have welcomed these refugees with remarkable warmth and unending support!
